






## Advances in Carton Recycling Over the Last 5 Years

### Our Perspective on the New Legislation

- We are "one-step" removed BUT...
- The new legislative framework will directly impact our organization's ability to realize our vision of diverting every carton from disposal





## What Should the New Legislative Framework Do?



#### 1. Allow for more flexibility



- Allow for various options via which producers can discharge their obligation by removing the requirement to join and pay fees to a single designated agency
- Include packaging suppliers in the design and implementation of product stewardship strategies.



#### 2. Improve Ontario's Low Diversion Rates

- Require all packaging types for which there are recycling markets, including cartons, to be collected.
- Harmonize the Blue Box system to minimize consumer confusion
- Expand away-from home recovery, including school-based diversion
- Enact disposal bans for all packaging types for which markets exist



#### 3. Clear Roles and Responsibilities



- Put in place minimum efficiency and cost-control standards to reflect the optimal level of service necessary to reach the targets and obligations imposed on producers
- Ensure the system is transparent
- Avoid duplication of efforts and conflicting mandates



# 4. Support Ontario's Climate Change Strategy

- Any measures that can increase diversion rates will support the Ontario Government's climate change goals
- Recycling = GHG emissions compared to landfilling
- Award/recognize those producers who take actions to decrease their overall carbon footprint

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## **Exploring Common Grounds**









- 1) Clear definition of "IC&I" waste & increase recycling beyond residential sector
- 2) Access to data by all parties
- 3) Oversight via independent authority clearinghouse
- 4) Pursue economies of scale within processing infrastructure where feasible
- 5) Maintain current geographic equity of BB services
- 6) Hold municipalities/service providers to the same performance standards
- 7) Harmonize materials collected in BB system
- 8) EfW preferable to landfilling
- 9) Enact disposal bans for materials with established end-markets



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
