




Advances in Carton Recycling Over the Last 5 Years

Used Cartons are in Demand


- Official grade established by ISRI (<u>www.isri.org</u>) in 2011
- PSI-52 Grade Aseptic Packaging and Gable-Top Cartons: Consists of liquid packaging board containers including empty, used, polyethylene (PE)-coated, printed one-side aseptic and gable-top cartons containing no less than 70% bleached chemical fiber and may contain up to 6% aluminum foil and 24% PE film. Prohibitive Materials may not exceed 2%. Outthrows plus prohibitives may not exceed 5%.



 Sending cartons to end market in their own grade (PSI-52) ensures more cartons get recycled. Pulp mills apply optimized saturation and conditioning to carton bales which differ from other fiber commodities. These optimal carton settings ensure a maximum yield of fiber from gable top and aseptic cartons.



According to Jason Pelz, Vice President of Recycling Projects for the Carton Council, the demand for cartons from both overseas and domestic markets continues to be good. In the case of export markets for cartons, they have been consistently strong and consequently, so are the prices paid when shipping export. In the current recycling markets context characterized by stagnant fibre prices, cartons have performed well and the difference in price paid between cartons and mixed paper has been growing, further incentivizing MRFs to positively sort cartons.

CARTON RECYCLING PROMOTION & EDUCATION RESOURCES AND VIDEO NOW AVAILABLE

The CCC has developed eye-catching carton recycling ads that can be used by municipalities to support their promotion and education efforts. The ads can be used in print media, including the ONA/OCNA in-kind advertising program, as well as outdoor advertising media (buses, transit posters, arena placement) and electronic advertising. The ads are customizable so that municipality-specific information can be added (e.g. name, web site address, type of collection container). A dedicated ad for two-stream programs has also been created. A series of carton images representing all carton types (juice, milk, soup, broths, etc.) are also available for download. 
